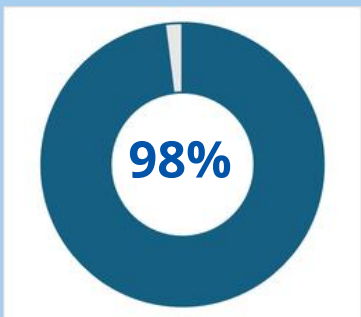
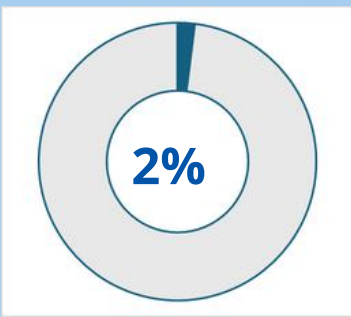

1 Fish purchases by SALICA over the period 01.10.2022-31.12.2023 by type of provider:

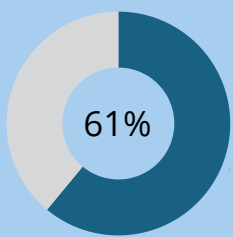

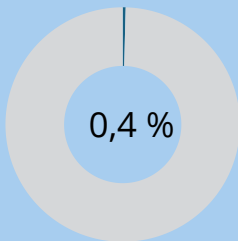

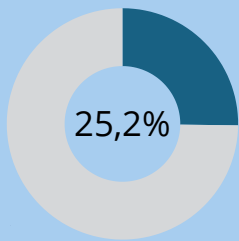
2 Fish purchases by SALICA over the period 01.10.2022-31.12.2023 by origin of fishery resource:



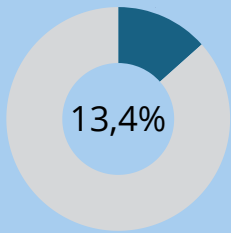

In accordance with the provisions of our Responsible Purchasing Policy, we are working every day to improve the sustainability of the fishery resource, committing to reduce the percentages of purchases of fish that do not belong to any of the established categories by at least 1% in 2024 to reach a reduction of 2% in 2025, increase purchases from MSC certified fisheries by 4% in 2024 to reach 10% in 2025, and not purchase from FIPS participating fisheries that have not made progress in the previous 24 months for the next two years.

On the other hand, we will follow monitoring our purchases of Yellowfin tuna from Indian Ocean that we have reduced this year between 11%-22% respect to purchases done during 2017-2019 years.
